

STRAWBERRY PRODUCTION WITH NATURAL FERTILIZERS

Introduction: The district of Santa Lúcia do Piaí, located in Caxias do Sul, southern Brazil, is a place one of its main activities. It can be seen that most farms use treatments on their strawberries to make them grow faster and healthier, but healthier, but most of these treatments consist of artificial chemicals, and this can harm the environment. The idea behind the project is to replace these chemicals with natural products. Objectives: This work aims to show that chemical and artificial fertilizers are not necessary, we can use natural and organic fertilizers that are sustainable and organic fertilizers that are sustainable and can open up new opportunities for people who can't afford artificial fertilizers. Can afford artificial fertilizers, which can easily be replaced by natural fertilizers and have similar results. natural ones and have similar results. Methodological procedures: The methodological procedure is: 1- on three strawberry seedlings, fertilize with tanned natural fertilizer obtained from fertilizer obtained from local pig farms and sawdust; 2- on another three seedlings, fertilize with artificial chemical fertilizer, like on farms; 3- on three seedlings, do not use any type of three seedlings, no fertilizer of any kind will be used, in order to control the experiment. All the seedlings will be in the same sunlight and irrigation conditions. Expected results: We hope that the seedlings grow healthy, even without fertilizer. However, we expect the strawberry seedling without fertilizer will develop less, as it does not receive any type of fertilizer. Final thoughts: We can't answer for sure, but we have hypotheses: fertilized seedlings are expected to fertilized seedlings will grow equally, with the help of organic and/or natural fertilizer alone, thus proving that it is possible to produce strawberries with fertilizer, that it is possible to produce strawberries with natural fertilizers in a sustainable way. 
<u>End to Violence</u>: "Dreaming of a world without violence, where families and communities are free from domestic violence, crime, and fear."

We need to start as an individual to dream of a world where humans live in harmony with wish of protecting our planet for future generations."



Regarding the function of the school, the student states that: "the school, an agent that exercises the function of forming citizens able to live in society, lacks sustainable guidelines... achieve this objective and its purpose. In addition, to promote a teaching focused on sustainability". In the student's report, the need for effective action by government agencies to combat negative environmental impacts is highlighted, where she states: "The government is a determining agent in the fight against environmental impacts, since it is responsible for promoting the social well-being, it is up to him to inspect whether companies and industries use the resources available in nature appropriately and generate fines for those that cause great damage to the ecosystem... The use of renewable energy sources and rationalizing the exploitation of mineral resources are a way of helping the cause. Only with the mobilization of all - government, parents, society and teachers - together will we achieve a better planet for current and future generations". Final considerations: In view of the above, it can be said that the student is concerned with aspects related to sustainability and her desire for a sustainable world is highlighted, including the actions of the government, school (teachers), parents and society. The student's environmental awareness is evident and her appeal to her stands out when describing: "It is crucial to keep in mind that, if each individual does their part for her, little by little there will be a significant and revolutionary change".

they might be able to make new connections and feel loved.







ARAUCARIA, TAKE ACTION TO AVOID EXTINCTION

Introduction: The Atlantic Forest biome is beneficial to human health. It is a biome that with many species of fauna and flora. This biome is threatened with extinction, almost 90% of its original area has already been degraded. The Araucaria Forest is part of the Atlantic Forest biome. Biome, and its characteristic species is Araucaria angustifolia. Preserving the Araucaria will bring benefits to animals, people and also contribute to the preservation of the biome. **Objective**: To preserve the araucaria, one of our native trees, so that our future generations have the chance to live in lush nature, with sustainability and health. Methodological **procedures**: Cultivate the araucaria by planting pine nuts in small reused pots or glasses so that people can see the importance of planting them, so that they can follow its growth phases and thus feel motivated to cultivate this tree. Expected results: On July 22, 2023, pine nuts were planted for the experiment and by August 30th of the same year, only a few had started to sprout. According to the germination time is between 20 and 40 days. We have some seedlings that we had already planted before this work; these are already big enough to be transferred to the forest. transferred to the forest. It is worth noting that the Araucaria produces pine nuts, which serve as food for animals and people. We would also like to highlight the importance of the blue jay in this process, because as it lives in the Atlantic Forest, it is it that helps in the natural planting of the araucarias, spreading pine nuts with its beak. However, this bird is almost threatened with extinction, which makes us even more worried. Final considerations: We observed that germination is slow and the seedlings that are ready were planted about six months ago. months ago. Therefore, knowing that an araucaria tree takes between forty and fifty years to become adult, we are sure that we can no longer wait to act. Introduction: When we try to form a collective conscience in the school context about the importance of caring for and preserving the environment in which we are inserted, we seek to instigate and encourage these students to think and reflect their social practice inside and outside the school context, in the perspective of to care for and have an environment that seeks sustainability. Objective: To identify and describe how a 6th grade student perceives the current world, full of difficulties in taking care of the environment and its implications in the context of sustainability, inserting this reflection in her school context and the region where she lives. Methodology: The collection of information took place in that school, in a place far from the classroom, to avoid interference and noise a 12-yearold student, attending the 6th year of the Municipal School Maria de Lourdes Silva, located in the municipality of Casserengue-PB, Brazil, where she volunteered to describe the articulated theme of sustainability. The student described her perception of how she sees and understands the environment in the region where she lives and highlights the following thought: "we all know that we need to take care of the environment and we should not mistreat it, as it contributes to our health. How can we take care of him? We can take care of it, not cutting down the forests, not throwing garbage in the rivers, not throwing garbage in the streets, planting more trees, not cutting down the trees, not wasting too much water, throwing the garbage in its proper places for collection and reusing the water". The student states that we must take care of the environment in which we live and her concern about the finitude of this environment caused by anthropic actions is clear, and this is clear when she tells us: "what is left of it" Thus, the student describes:" The environment exists for us to take care of, to preserve it and not destroy what remains of it. Here in my city, I see that most people throw their garbage in the middle of the streets and that makes me sad and I think that the city government should educate its residents more to take care of garbage and the planet". Considerations: It appears that the student has support from the school and family regarding her training in relation to the environment that must be taken care of in order to keep it clean and safe. Introduction: Currently, it is urgent to provoke critical thinking in the school environment regarding the relevance of preserving historical and cultural heritage in a sustainable way and safeguarding it for future generations. objective: To describe how a 6th grade student at the public Elementary School "Maria de Lourdes", in the municipality of Casserengue – PB, Brazil, perceives the world in which she lives in the context of preserving the local historical heritage and seeks to safeguard her memory and history towards sustainability. Methodology: The collection of information took place in that school, in a place far from the classroom, to avoid interference and noise, with a student who is just 12-years-old that volunteered to describe the articulated theme of sustainability. Results: The School is located close to this historical and cultural wealth and tries to sensitize students about the importance of these and other surrounding locations, such a perception can be understood in the student's description: "At school, my teacher always talks about taking care of the environment so that everyone can live in peace and take advantage of its natural resources in a conscious and polite way" the student also points out that the animals and stories that are being extinct due to the lack of environmental awareness of the people around the Serra, as we can understand in her speech "... my city has a beautiful mountain called Caxexa, my grandmother says that it is very old and that Indians lived in the highest part of the mountain and there were many animals that today no longer exist, because human beings hunted and destroyed their environment... I went to the mountains and there I saw many red paintings of animals that I think no longer exist today do to the lack of preservation and care for nature". In the student's description, the concern with transforming this space into a preservation area is understood, where public bodies organize awareness events to keep the historical cultural heritage preserved in a sustainable way, with an eye on the future: "I also saw many words written in ink in the mountains black with the names of people and other drawings that dirty the paintings of the Indians and I think that the city hall could organize events to teach the population to take care of the place, not dirtying and destroying these records of the past... they could create a preservation park so that everyone could visit and take care of the place that has the history of the men who lived before us". Conclusions: It is noticed that the school and the student's family helped her to develop a critical view of the historical and cultural heritage of her region, denoting the appreciation and importance of these historical and environmental sites to be cared for and preserved as well as stated below: "It doesn't matter where we may live, far or close to nature, the important thing is to know how to care for and preserve it... I believe that if things were like that, everyone would be happier".



Life below the sea and above the land is full of plastic which is very harmful for living beings. On the other hand, it poses problems when it comes to their disposal. For example, packets containing fast food cannot be reused to store food again. So, what do we do with these items? Most often, these are thrown into the dustbin, which is then collected by the municipal corporation. But what if they are not disposed of properly? We have seen heaps of garbage lying along the roads or in the drains or other water bodies, clogging them. Plastics, supposed to be a boon to the environment is now becoming a bane. Improper disposal of plastic poses a number of problems.

The littering of plastics in open spaces creates unhygienic conditions, as it acts as a breeding ground for insects and mosquitoes that cause diseases. Plastics do not undergo degradation, thus, stay in the soil for many years, which affects soil fertility and its quality. When plastic artifacts enter the drainage and sewerage system, they block the pipes and the drains causing water logging. The improperly disposed of food bags, when eaten by animals, cause stomach and intestine related diseases which even lead to suffocation and death. Plastic items find their way to the river and other water bodies, which are then swallowed by fish, seabirds, and other marine species, thus leading to suffocation and death. The waste from the plastic manufacturing industry is thrown directly into the water bodies, thus affecting the chemical property of water, causing hazards on a very large scale.

To reduce this we can simply follow the 6 R's-Rethink, Refuse, Reduce, Reuse, Repair, and Recycle. When you refuse to reuse it's the earth you abuse. Follow your duty to maintain Earth's beauty. We need to slow the flow of plastic at its source, but we also need to improve the way we manage our plastic waste. Eco bricks is a much needed solution for single use plastic waste. To make an eco brick follow the steps below-

- Step 1 Collect clean and dry single use plastic waste
- Step 2 Find a clean, dry 2-liter cold drink bottle with a lid
- Step 3 Compress the waste into the bottle with a stick
- Step 4 Pack tightly throughout the process to ensure it is fully compressed
- Step 5 Put the lid back on and your eco brick is ready to be built with.

Abstract

Goal 7 specifically relates to affordable and clean energy, while Goal 11 focuses on sustainable cities and communities, which encompasses the promotion of energy-efficient and sustainable buildings. The UN has recognised the critical role that energy efficiency in buildings plays in achieving multiple SDGs, including those related to climate action, poverty reduction, and environmental sustainability. Currently, we are focusing on energy efficiency and sustainability in commercial buildings using Artificial Intelligence (AI). An essential tactic for attaining the objective of lowering energy demand and enhancing energy efficiency in commercial buildings is accurately estimating energy consumption in such buildings. Commercial buildings fall into particular categories of different types of structures with high energy usage. They thus provide a great opportunity to define and understand the energy use of a group of mixed-use buildings. Our research presents novel machine learning and artificial intelligence techniques for setting up energy baselines and energy performance indicators in commercial buildings in order to identify potentials for electrical energy consumption reduction in buildings and establish energy management strategies related to electricity use. This data is anticipated to follow a pattern comparable to actual data obtained from energy meters installed throughout various zones of high-end commercial buildings. This study contrasts the earlier used conventional methods with the unique methodology of computing the baseline. In order to accurately measure the energy consumption of the building, some of the key factors that affect operating system energy consumption in the buildings were researched and taken into account, such as the level of granularity of data from various energy meters and weather conditions like temperature. It is concluded that the methodology suggested for baselining energy consumption using a Machine Learning & AI is more accurate than conventional approaches. This will aid facility management teams in conducting root cause analyses on high energy-consumption equipment and may be useful for pricey equipment's preventive maintenance. In this way, new frameworks for green buildings using AI can be initiated through United Nations, which will involve a collaborative and multistep process that engages member states, international organizations, experts, and stakeholders.
